Course Description (from the AP Statistics website)

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the major concepts and tools for collecting, analyzing, and drawing conclusions from data. Students are exposed to four broad conceptual themes:

- Exploring Data: Describing patterns and departures from patterns
- Sampling and Experimentation: Planning and conducting a study
- Anticipating Patterns: Exploring random phenomena using probability and simulation
- Statistical Inference: Estimating population parameters and testing hypotheses

Goals

- To master the AP Statistics curriculum
- To appreciate and understand the role of statistics in the world of mathematics and in the "real world".
- To communicate ideas so they are clear, concise, and easily understood.
- To score well on the AP Exam.

Tests/Quizzes

- Tests and quizzes will include multiple-choice and free response questions from previous AP
 exams. These will be graded as they would be on the AP exam. The free response questions
 ALWAYS require a good explanation with complete sentences, appropriately supported by
 graphs and/or calculations. No credit will be given for correct answers without appropriate
 support and explanation.
- Some guizzes will be unannounced.
- ALL tests will include at least one AP free-response question that uses material we covered earlier in the semester.
- There will be NO retakes of tests and quizzes. Please be prepared the first time.

Homework

- Homework will be assigned each night. It will be graded based on the flip of a coin. Heads, I check it; tails, I don't.
- Homework is NOT accepted late!

Participation

- Students are expected to participate fully in all assignments during class.
- Each quarter you will receive a two-part participation grade:
 - o Part 1: Do Now grade
 - Part 2: An average of any collected in-class grades
- Hall Passes Each quarter you will receive 4 hall passes. You may use these to go to the locker, use the restroom, etc. Each pass you have not used at the end of the quarter will result in 2 bonus points added to your participation grade.

Weekly AP Problems

• Each Monday you will be assigned 1-3 AP Problems that will be collected on Friday. The problems can be found on the AP Stats web page. You will be graded based on the effort put into the assignment. It DOES NOT have to be correct, it just MUST be clear that you have made an attempt at the problem.

Attendance/Tardiness
